Cree-Québec Forestry Board Communication Plan 2023-2028 Adopted February 2024

Context

Among its main responsibilities, the Cree-Québec Forestry Board (CQFB) must monitor, report on, and assess implementation of the forestry-related chapter (Chapter 3) of the Agreement Concerning a New Relationship Between the Government of Québec and the Crees of Québec signed in 2002. It also ensures monitoring of the implementation processes for the preparation, consultation, and monitoring of the territory's forest management plans at the Joint Working Group (JWG) level.

In October 2017, the parties' signatories of the original Agreement agreed on a harmonized agreement which reinforces certain points of the original agreement, specifies responsibilities and adds new elements. Consequently, it has become important to adapt the Board's communication plan to take these changes into consideration.

Successful Adapted Forestry Regime (AFR) implementation requires a very well-structured, global communication plan that engages both parties to the Agreement and the Board in keeping with their respective roles and responsibilities. Those affected directly or indirectly by the Agreement must know all of the AFR's elements, the implementation mechanisms, each stakeholder's role, the responsibilities and the results obtained.

The parties' representatives have committed to develop communication activities, based on their objectives and responsibilities. The CQFB 2023-2028 communication plan essentially describes the elements under the Board's responsibility. A mechanism for coordinating the parties' and Board's communication activities is planned in order to maximize the spinoffs of AFR communication activities.

The CQFB wishes to help enhance better knowledge of the AFR and ensure that the main actors concerned by the implementation of the Paix des Braves' forestry-related provisions are aware of its reality and results. The Board also wishes to contribute to fostering discussions between the stakeholders concerned by and interested in the territory's Adapted Forestry Regime.

Communications issues

- 1. The joint tour of the parties to present to the Cree communities the modifications to the Agreement made by the 6th Amendment was never carried out.
- 2. The Board's role and mandate are very often misunderstood by the various actors involved in the implementation of Chapter III of the Agreement.
- 3. The beneficial contribution to the Crees of the consultation and harmonization process provided for in the Agreement compared to the rest of the Québec territory is not sufficiently promoted.
- 4. Need to reinforce the collaboration and horizontal communication between the coordinators and the Joint Working Groups (JWGs).
- 5. The positive progress and efforts of the parties regarding the implementation of Chapter III of the Agreement are not sufficiently highlighted.
- 6. There are still discrepancies or misunderstandings of the specific terms of the Agreement and forest management concepts among tallymen and Cree members of the joint working groups.
- 7. Lack of visibility regarding the promotion of the Board's knowledge acquisition projects.

- B. Promote the exchange of information and strengthen communication channels between the main stakeholders in the implementation of the Adapted Forestry Regime.
